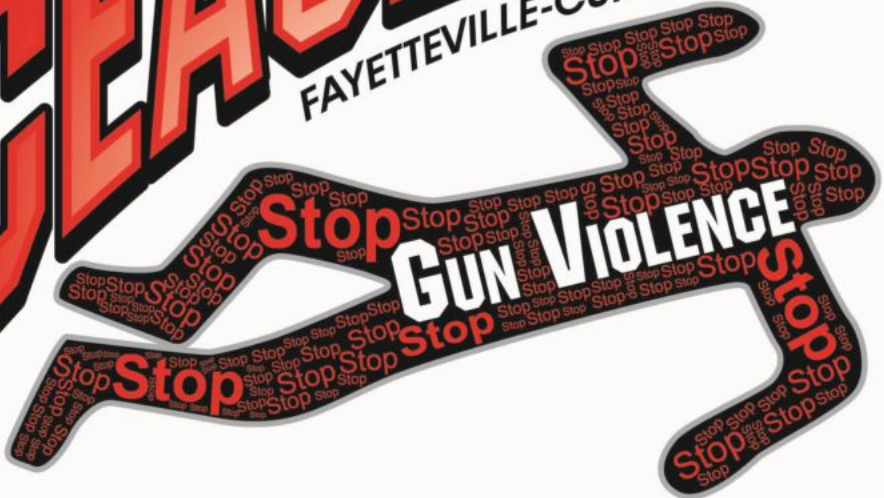

Our Violent Crimes Task Force reviews each case involving recovered firearms for possible referral to the US Attorney's Office



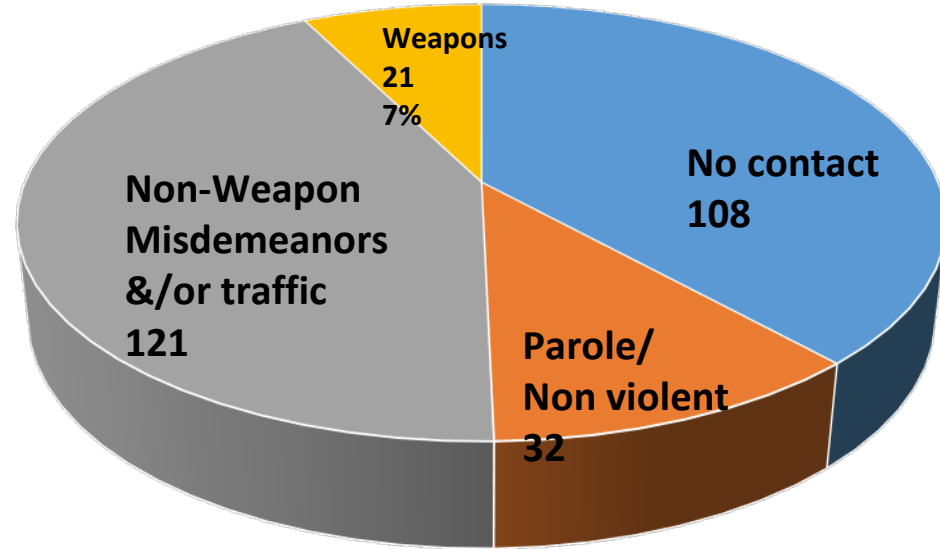
- 35 repeat offenders have been federally indicted within the past 12 months
- 58 additional cases are currently pending for review

The Fayetteville Cumberland Reentry Council (FCRC) was officially formed in January 2015 by Jessie L. Garner and Lisa Jayne, bringing together several partnering agencies from the city and the county. These organizations included representatives from Workforce Development, Cape Fear Valley Health and Fayetteville Police Department's Operation Ceasefire.

State funding was received in November 2017 making the FCRC the 14th Reentry Council in North Carolina.

- Overall violent crime for this age group has decreased 10% city wide since the program began

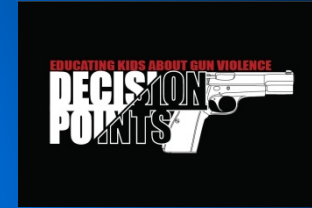
