What is LInX?



- ➤ A regional approach to the sharing of law enforcement data among participating local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies to reduce crime
- Provides all participants with secure, daily access to cross-jurisdictional law enforcement data:
 - Force multiplier
 - Investigative lead generator
 - Increases agent/officer situational awareness and safety
 - Identifies previously unknown relationships/associates



Origins of Program



Problem:

- Local-state-federal sharing of LE data inadequate --
 - Locals often lack context for suspicious events of interest to DON
 - Info-sharing between jurisdictions informal, non-automated

> Solution:

- Build LInX regional data warehouses
 - Automated sharing of local/state/federal data
 - Ability to search, link, and analyze all data
 - Board of Governance oversees each site
 - Strictly limited to Law Enforcement data

Status:

- Operational in Ten Regions (and)
- Department of Defense Information Exchange (D-DEx)






What's In Linx? - Linx Record Types












Regional LInX Systems







Free text search capabilities



- Proximity Search (bomb within 2 words of threat)
- Thesaurus Capabilities (murder/homicide, marijuana/reefer, William/Bill/Billy, ...)

> 12 iXv Chart Viewer

- Graphical representation of structured/unstructured data
- Capability to "walk data" to reveal relationships between entities (people, places, vehicles, phone numbers, weapons)
- Export Capability to I2 Analyst Notebook

Mapping Capabilities

- Ability to view LInX search results on a map
- Incorporation of map layers for specific areas (ie, critical infrastructure)








LInX to LInX Regions - Map








Addition of SLED to LInX



LInX Expansion



- Charlotte Mecklenburg IBM CopLink / LInX Carolinas Connection (Complete & on-line)
 - LEXS SR Web Services Connection Active
 - Users of either system can run queries
- New LInX Carolinas Agencies (Complete & on-line by 10/30/13)
 - Greensboro PD
 - High Point PD
 - Buncombe CO SO (includes Ashville PD & Woodfin PD)
 - Winston-Salem PD (includes Forsyth County SO)
 - Rocky Mount PD



LInX Expansion



- South Carolina SLED (Completed & on-line)
 - Integration of Records Management System Incident Reports for 256
 South Carolina agencies providing 26 Million records
- Federal LE Agencies (Completed & on-line)
 - FBI, DEA, ATFE, USMS, Secret Service, DHS ICE, Border Patrol
- Military LE Agencies (Completed & on-line)
 - Air Force OSI, Army CID, Navy, USMC, Army & Air Force LE (DoD mandates all must use LInX)



Interoperability – Renewed Emphasis From Chiefs & Sheriff's Nationwide

- > All LinX Regions are interconnected
 - Users can search locally or can search any combination of other LInX regions via LInX 2 LInX
- > IBM CopLink Node Connections
 - Charlotte Mecklenburg (CHARMEC CRISS)
 - Alaska (ALEISS)
 - Mesa Arizona PD (pilot)
 - San Bernardino California
